Plant new Christian communities. Plan and execute church planting. Local: Community plants in partnership with other congregations Foreign: As partners with Presbytery in Eastern Uganda



T

he mission of the Finance & Property Committee is to provide oversight of the management of the church's financial resources and oversee the management and maintenance of all church property.

During the calendar year 2011, the Property and Finance Committee oversaw the completion and the opening of the newly expanded and renovated library. The grand opening for this facility was in January 2011 and continues to be a popular destination at FPCE. The library is staffed by a group of volunteers who come each week to ensure it is stocked with current reading material and the books are properly catalogued and maintained for easy reference. Other volunteers are present on Sunday mornings to assist any who wish to avail themselves of the opportunities the library affords.

In September our staff was enhanced with the addition of Marvin Houston as Facilities Director. His years of experience have been invaluable in reprogramming and upgrading our physical plant.

This year, we were able to apply \$504,000 toward servicing our mortgage with Bank of the West, bringing that balance to \$2,855,887 at year's end.

The church continues to be a vibrant part of our community as we host, among other groups, Women's Bible Study Fellowship, several small bible study groups, our scout troop, the YMCA, and the Edmond Family Center for Autism. Our custodial staff prepares meeting space for an average of forty groups per week as we remain externally focused in the use of this wonderful facility.

The finance mission of this Committee continued to work smoothly with the very capable church staff, this year welcoming Steven Marsh, Executive Pastor, as a staff liaison. The year end financial report prepared by FPCE Member and Treasurer Rick Roberts is attached, offering insight into the management of that aspect of our church life.

Treasurer's Report

In 2011 our members generously gave to God's work \$2,310,894 or 98.6% of the General Fund Budget. We were good stewards of the General Fund and expenses were below the budget by 0.8%, and total expenses were \$2,369,422. Unfortunately, we ended the year with a deficit of \$58,528.

Contributions to Stone by Stone IV for 2011 totaled \$564,356 for the year. We were able to make additional principal reduction payments of \$205,000, over and above the required \$299,432 debt service on our mortgage at Bank of the West, reducing our sanctuary loan balance to only \$2,855,887!

During the year the public accounting firm of Bell & Rhodes performed an audit of the financial statements of FPCE in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Standards as of December 31, 2010. We received a "clean" audit opinion and there were no negative findings as a result of their audit.

As we move forward, we need all of us to fulfill our pledges in order to see the Church continue to grow and be a blessing to our membership, community and the world.

Thank you for your generosity during these challenging times.

T

he Denominational Relations Committee seeks to maintain our relations with Indian Nations Presbytery, other churches within the Presbytery and with the Presbytery officers. We welcome the opportunity to offer assistance to the smaller Presbyterian churches in the Presbytery in whatever ways are appropriate.

In addition, the committee is responsible for monitoring actions and activities within the denomination, and communicating and informing the Session and membership about denominational issues and decisions that will impact our congregation.

The PC(USA) is in a state of flux as our congregation, along with many others, considers how to respond to the dramatic changes in doctrine introduced into the denomination as a result of decisions approved in 2011. Among others, these decisions include defacto approval of ordination regardless of sexual life style, a reduction in the view of Scripture from being authoritative for our lives to merely being a guide (truth is progressive and in the eye of the beholder), language introduced into the Book of Order that is universalistic in nature, and authorization of church membership for any person regardless of theological conviction, including the guarantee of full participation and representation. A great deal of time has been spent through the year evaluating various options for response to the denominational changes. That review continues as we enter 2012.

Denominational Relations has continued to support several of the Renewal organizations in the PC(USA), both with money and with the involvement of committee members who are serving on the Boards of both PFR (Presbyterians for Renewal), Presbyterian Action and the Presbyterian Coalition. Members of the committee attended several national meetings of evangelicals during the year, including five members and two pastors attending a "Fellowship of Presbyterians" gathering in Minneapolis. In addition the Presbytery Commissioners (plus the pastors) represented our church at the three called meetings of Indian Nations Presbytery.

Personnel

To assist the Session in the implementation of its Book of Order responsibilities, the Personnel Committee provides support and guidance to church staff members and committee chairpersons in the areas of recruiting, hiring, compensation, benefits, employee relations, personnel policy formulation, and performance management.

While the Personnel Committee serves in an advisory capacity to the Session, the Session is responsible for the overall health and ministry of the church.

Our church's by-laws state that the Personnel Committee shall be made up of at least one Elder or Deacon, the Immediate Past Chairperson, and two or more Members-at-Large from the congregation.

Your Personnel Committee's activity during 2011 includes the following:

- 1 Provided guidance and assistance in the personnel changes and additions during the year.
- 2 Developed and/or approved Job Descriptions for: Associate Pastor, Parish Nurse, Director of Student Ministries, Information Systems Support & Scheduling Coordinator, Administrative Assistant to Executive Pastor, Receptionist and Assistant to Associate Pastor, Elder Care Coordinator, Facilities Director, Kids' Ministry Program Coordinator, Associate Director for Middle School, Associate Director for High School, and Groundskeeper & Building Assistant.
- 3 Revised Organizational Chart to reflect changes with addition of Executive Pastor.
- 4 Worked with Pastor Nominating Committee in the hiring of the Associate Pastor.
- 5 Worked with Rev. John Gruel on transition to his new calling.
- 6 Updated Personnel Committee Operating Manual.
- 7 Reviewed and revised Personnel Policies as necessary.
- 8 Developed information for Narrative Budget.

The Communication Department met and overcame many challenges this year. As in previous years, a limited budget forced a more focused use of resources.

The internal computer network and the consistency of its use were greatly improved thanks to the work of Melissa Tisdell, an outside consultant and the purchase of some needed upgrades in hardware.

A Communication Task Force, chaired by Dan Martel, was formed to determine the most efficient approach to expanding God's word by reaching members, the un-churched and our neighbors in the community. The Task Force began with a clean slate approach and looked at all possible manner of communicating God's word to determine the methods that would be most effective for FPCE. They studied the successes of other churches and viewed their websites for opportunities that First Pres could take advantage of. It was determined that our website, newsletter, and an increase in the use of video, both online and for worship would improve our exposure to members and non members searching for answers.

The way of reaching the next generation was determined to be through electronic media. Facebook, Twitter, videos and blogs may not be influential to a large portion of our congregation, but to the younger, outside world they are essential daily means of staying in touch with each other and with

Kids' Ministries

We had another great year in Kids' Ministries! First, we began the new year with a wonderful trip of about 30 of our 4th and 5th graders and their parents to SuperStart Live in Dallas, Texas. Our kids laughed, screamed, and learned that true strength and courage comes from knowing that God is with us as we face our fears.

During the cold weather, we had a chili cook-off fundraiser to raise money for our computer lab and we were able to purchase all new computers. In February, Linda Birsner went to a ReThink Family Ministry Conference at Group Publishing in Loveland, Co. There she met some wonderful colleagues whom she continues to share ideas and ministry. The meaningful time was spent in an intimate setting with Brian Haynes, author of Shift and took an indepth look of faith milestones in a person's life and how the church and family can prepare for them, embrace them, and celebrate them.

Shelly Fryer and Linda Birsner went to the Children's Pastors' Conference in San Diego, CA for a week in March. They were filled to the brim and were definitely overflowing with ideas and renewed energy and a fresh calling to new ministry for Christ. One of the highlights included a major emphasis on having the home be the primary place for spiritual direction, leadership, and growth with the help of the church. As a result, we began Spiritual Parenting classes. Another huge takeaway was the Big God Story and seeing the Bible as God's story with all of us, past and present, having a part in His story.

In April, we celebrated the resurrection of Jesus by giving Easter baskets to the children at the City Rescue Mission. With Easter egg hunting kits, families were encouraged to have neighborhood Easter egg hunts to share the gospel of Christ in a fun and nonthreatening way. In May, we had our annual fifth grade Mother/Daughter tea as well as a Servant Celebration for all who shared in the ministry of the children.

During the summer, we had "All the time in the World" as we shared in 4 big events and a bonus feature. Throughout the entire summer, we held Vacation Bible School during Sunday School with a SonSurf Beach Bash. We began the summer with a family fun day at Vox Printing with a huge water slide, mud pit, cookout and lots of other games. We reached out to the community with a Pandamania in the Park.

Partnering with Santa Fe Presbyterian Church, we held a one evening VBS community event at Hafer Park. Several people who just happened to be at the park as well as members,

friends and neighbors all joined together to enjoy the fun of being "wild about God."

Wonderful Wacky Waterplay at First Presbyterian encouraged children to witness the many ways water is incorporated throughout the Bible. Kids climbed, jumped and slid down an inflatable waterslide and a super long slip and slide along with other fun activities. We also had several outings together to the Regional Food Bank, blackberry picking, Bounce N Craze and more! We ended the summer with a pool party at Pelican Bay. A group of 3rd-5th graders and fearless leaders descended on Camp Kidjam in Denton, Texas in July. We were zapped by God's power, love and grace! It would be a challenge to find a group of kids more excited!


We continued our Rolling Green Outreach ministry in collaboration with other churches during the summer by sharing sack suppers and lots of fun and games each Thursday evening at the apartment complex. Throughout the year, we continued to have weekly Backyard Bible Clubs, Little Lambs, monthly holiday parties, a Santa store, and meet the needs of individual families. As relationships grew, we saw the mission truly being lived out by bringing the love of Christ to a community in need.

In the fall, we had a great Parent Teacher Orientation encouraging everyone to make the discipleship of our children a priority. We began our Sunday School rotation by examining the lives of "People Who made a Difference" and the kids were challenged to make a difference for Christ in their worlds. We began BLAST again on Wednesday evenings for kids' faith to really take off! Childcare & Preschool Ministries

We continue to grow strong and healthy in 2011! We have seen a continued growth in young families becoming involved in the life of the church. **Little Lambs:** our outreach ministry which was continued in 2011, has proven to be a positive growth area. Its evangelistic approach to ministry for 2's and 3's has enabled us to focus on 8 students at a time for 6 weeks of classes. We had 20 children participate in the program this year, and half of them have not been "regular" church kids. **Rolling Green:** The Little Lambs class has continued to meet at the Rolling Green apartment complex on Thursday mornings. Shelly and Linda continue to be active in the Rolling Green collaborative acting as board chairmen. The childcare department also hired 4 of the women that we have built relationships with from Rolling Green. **VBS During Sunday School** was another great success for preschool ministry. Our 3-5 year olds were able to participate in large group worship with the elementary children, and then

split into age appropriate craft, snacks, and lessons with their own crew leaders. The relationships they had with their youth volunteers was an added bonus! **We continue to have childcare for the Edmond Family Center for Autism support group.** This support group meets at our church every second Tuesday of the month. We offer childcare for birth-age 12. This has been a wonderful opportunity for our staff with the addition of supplemental training from experienced therapists in the field of autism.

Our regular Sunday morning and Wednesday JAM activities remain strong. We continue to provide morning and evening nurseries for Small Groups, Miriam Circle, Bible Study groups, MOPS and meetings. We had approximately 4,800 children attend childcare ministry this year!

During the year 2011, the Missions Committee met monthly on the first Monday of each month from 6 pm. The chairperson was Jeff Oakes through November 2011. The committee was advised and assisted by Associate Pastor John Gruel.

The committee notes that our church supported many missions and activities throughout the year. These included a mission trip to San Cosme, Yucatan, Mexico where a doctor, nurse, and a dentist were supplied. Water filters were also distributed. A working relationship was established between Living Waters for the World and Cancun, Mexico to supply a water purification system in June 2012.

Upendo Kids (Kenya Missions) volunteers took a trip to Kenya where school, medical and food supplies were distributed. The Kenya Adopt-A-Child project continues to be a major success with over 30 kids receiving \$30 monthly support. Other projects for 2012 include possible solar panel installation in a Presbyterian church, and a deep well construction to provide clean water for over 2000 villagers.

The Uganda team of seventeen helped plant a new Presbyterian church in the Kabwagazi village in Uganda. The good news of Jesus Christ was shared in many crusades where up to 250 people were in attendance each day. A team doctor, nurse and local medical personnel attended to over 1000 villagers. As a result of many crusade, hundreds made first time commitment to Jesus Christ. The Covenant Bible Institute of Theology (CBIT) supported by FPCE, graduated 50 new pastors.

Other organizations our church supports include: Turning Point Ministries, Brandon Boyd & Campus Crusade for Christ, Hope Center, Goodland Academy, Kairos, Infant Crisis Center, City Rescue Mission, Breakfast on Boulevard, Presbyterian Urban Mission, WhizKids, Claire Bryant & Brent Ewing's Student Mobilization, the Krause family, the Tappert family and Kevin Ewing's Mission to India.

Our three-year goal is to engage 250 active students in our ministry, walked alongside by 50 trained and empowered adults, with 10 small groups. The Student Ministries staff and committee are dedicated to building the infrastructure to meet this goal under the framework contained in Sustainable Youth Ministry (Youth Architects).

Student ministries is relationally focused, as well as externally focused. Through these relationships our desire is for students to love God, love others, and serve. The avenues for these relationships to grow are varied: Lift, Sunday School, Soul Food, Tiger Club, HS Senior lunches, mission trips, and retreats. We also support Boy Scout Troop #78.

Middle School Lift – meets Wednesday nights for a time of worship, study, and fellowship. An average of approximately 35 youth and 8 adult leaders participate weekly. Both students and adults assume roles for connectors, welcomers, and leaders.

High School Lift – meets Sunday nights for a time of worship, study, and fellowship. An average of approximately 50 youth and 7 adult leaders participate weekly. Both students and adults assume roles for connectors, welcomers, and leaders.

Sunday School – While the curriculum put in place three years ago (Student Life) remains, the format has been revamped to provide more cohesion and energy. Brian Lamb has assumed the role of Sunday School coordinator and starts each Sunday in a large group setting, teeing up the lesson for the day before each class breaks into small groups led by Shepherds and Teachers. The High School Seniors are studying the True U video series developed by the Truth Project, accompanied by guest lecturers, to prepare them for life beyond high school. Approximately 65 youth and 12 adult leaders participate weekly.

8th Grade Confirmation Class is led by Jason Eliot; the 2011 class had 29 students, and the 2012 class has 23 students. Approximately 20 adult leaders assisted.



Soul Food had 20 students participate in various service projects throughout the metro area during the summer.

Tiger Club is a new after-school program serving 27 Central Middle School students that meets weekly to provide tutoring, social interaction, and life skills.

High School Senior Lunch serves over 150 Edmond high school seniors weekly at the Filling Station. Seven dedicated adults coordinate this program.

Mission Trips – This year six students, Brian Wagner, and Linda Birsner traveled by van to West Virginia to repair homes in the state's poorest county under the supervision of Craig Snow's Hope Force International. We continue to serve the youth of the Pauline Mayer Shelter through the Servant Hood Tree at Christmas, providing gifts and a party.

Retreats – Celebration #30, moderated by Caitlin Zuerker and #31, moderated by Conner Lisle took place at Canyon Camp, with over 120 youth and 12 adults participating. Other retreats this year were the Angel Fire High School Ski Trip (40 participants) and Middle School Fall Retreat at Jacob's Ladder (25 participants).

Boy Scout Troop #78 – 125 scouts and 118 leaders continue to be supported by our church, which provides facilities and resources.

T

he Bible gives many ways that Christians may exercise their faith. We are to meet together, study together and share our faith walk. Our church has many classes, studies and fellowship gatherings each week to help grow us as disciples to equip us to do God's work. Adult Discipleship provides opportunities for study and growth through our Adult Sunday school programs, small group ministries, the Library at First Presbyterian and the midweek program of The Gathering.

Adult Sunday school reaches 300 people each week and provides opportunity to encourage, teach and nurture God's people in a large group study. A continuing emphasis is placed on providing study materials that are biblically sound in a variety of mediums. Classes topics change quarterly with a variety of interests including Revelation, Old Testament, video studies of the Exodus from Egypt, Bible studies, Spiritual Gifts and Parenting classes.

Small group ministries: Women's and men's ministries focus on walking with Christ through small groups, Bible studies, gatherings, conferences, special programs and service to our congregation and community. Men from First Presbyterian attend Mo Ranch seminars, fellowship regularly each Friday morning at the Friday Morning Men's Group and study together in over ten small group Bible Studies. They are a wonderful source of help for many in our community through their support of the Time and Talent group of the Deacons and several other ministries.

The Women of First Presbyterian study with each other, strengthen our prayer lives and fellowship through the Presbyterian Women Circles, large and small group Bible Studies, MOPS, and the Friday Morning Women's Group. Our Bible Studies this year were "Anointed, Transformed, Redeemed" by Priscilla Shirer, Beth Moore and Kay Arthur, and in the fall the Beth Moore Study, "John, the Beloved Disciple." These groups meet either weekly or monthly and reach 350 women.

The Library at First Presbyterian is an inviting, comfortable family place where you will enjoy an outstanding collection of printed and non-printed resources. It supports the ministries of the church with materials that nurture growth in discipleship, provide for in-depth study and research and offer Biblical perspectives on issues that affect our lives. The children's library offers our younger disciples a collection of their own books and non-printed materials.

The Gathering, a Wednesday evening meal and study time in the spring and fall is a wonderful way to meet others around a table and in a small class setting.

It is a blessing to study and serve together in so many ways!

The Welcoming & Outreach committee helps organize the Christmas gift tree for Grace Living Center. One hundred presents were distributed in 2011. They also maintain the prayer list of FPCE college students and those serving in the military, prepare and mail care packages to college students during finals week- 35 in May and 35 in December, provide greeters at doors at both services on Sunday, and see that a Deacon is assigned to the flower ministry (refurbish flowers left from funerals or weddings and distribute to nursing homes).

In October, the Deacons conducted their yearly Call-a-Thon, when all members are contacted by a Deacon to see if the members have any updates to their general information, concerns, prayer requests, or needs that should be addressed. The congregation responds favorably to this annual event and much information is attained through the callings.

This year the Deacons adopted Central Middle School by providing money to initiate and support the monthly weekend food in backpacks to students in need. The program is currently supporting 20 students for the weekend meals. Extra food was distributed to the students to cover the Christmas break. Lisa Edwards, a member of FPCE, is the counselor at Central Middle School and in charge of the program.

The Deacons also serve as "Deacon of the Week." They help count the offering and serve as a greeter on a specific Sunday. Some Deacons sign up for hospital visitation each month. They visit members in the hospital and in long term care facilities.

A new Deacon Fund policy was established and approved by the Session in 2011. A six member committee now oversees the distribution of funds with Martha Turner serving as coordinator.

In 2011, the Congregational Care Ministry provided oversight for the care-giving needs of the congregation and assisted the pastors in one-on-one congregational care. It fostered a climate of caring for one another (guiding, healing, sustaining, and reconciling). It empowered others as disciples to meet these needs. The ministry also helped equip the saints through supporting, developing, and implementing appropriate ministries within the church and our community.

The primary goal of Congregational Care is to pay attention to what is happening in the lives of our members and offer love and care when and where it is needed. This is accomplished through a range of ministries and committees: Stephen Ministry, the Board of Deacons, Elder Care, the Samaritan Ministry/Deacon Fund, Turning Point Ministry, The Reserves, the Parish Nurse and the Pastors' Prayer Team.

The Reserves

The Reserves are Elders, Deacons, and Trustees from our church or a previous church who are not actively serving. They meet three times a year for updates on the life of the church and denomination and to meet new staff members. They support the ministries of the church as volunteers on various committees and with the ongoing needs of the church. Currently, there are approximately 75 Reserves.

Parish Nurse

Donna Plewes serves as FPCE's volunteer Parish Nurse. She is available to help members of the congregation with questions involving Medicare, insurance, etc. She also coordinates health related church wide activities.

Elder Care Coordinator

Rachel Boggess serves as FPCE's volunteer Coordinator of Elder Care. She meets with individuals and caregivers of members to provide assistance with aging needs and resources. One significant area she is able to offer help is with individuals facing memory issues and those needing to move to care facilities.

Turning Point Ministries

Turning Point Ministries is providing housing solutions for members and the community who have been living in sub-standard situations. To date, five families are occupying new brick homes in Edmond and four families are leasing new or clean used step-up homes in preparation for homeownership. In 2011, a duplex was completed for two families to lease and a new home has been started for a church member. A fund raiser golf tournament and a Turkey Trot was held in 2011. Oversight of this ministry is provided through a 12 person Board of Directors. Turning Point is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation.

active Stephen Ministers served care receivers in the program this year. Over 200 persons have been commissioned in the program since its inception in 1983. By year's end, four Stephen Ministers elected to go inactive, and two Stephen Ministers returned from sabbatical to become active. For the year, Stephen Ministers made a total of 530 Care Receiver visits and 350 phone calls.

The Stephen Minister Leaders Team ended the 2010 year with five members and began the 2011 year with five members with a departure in January of Pastor John Gruel, and with Martha Turner joining the team in January as Pastoral Liaison. Martha completed National Training in January. Stephen Leaders committed 200 hours to referral assignments, coordination, and Leaders' Meetings. Stephen Leaders committed 40 hours this fall in preparation and teaching the 2011-12 Training Class.

Stephen Minister meetings were held twice monthly totaling 24 hours of supervision in 2011 plus three sessions of Continuing Education. Continuing Education Programs were open to church members and the community.

Following a church service July 31, 2011, a Farewell Reception was held honoring John Gruel and Mark Britton for their service in our FPCE Stephen Ministry Program. Also honored was Mark Schlachtenhaufen, the current Stephen Ministry Historian who initiated the Stephen Ministry Registry in 2002.

A new Stephen Ministry Training Program began October 18, 2011, for five Trainees. One active Stephen Minister joined the Training Team to meet the required training class number. The five trainees will each complete 50 hours of training and will be commissioned in April 2012.

Steve Marsh, the new Executive Pastor of FPC and trained Stephen Ministry Leader, has enthusiastically become involved with the present FPC Stephen Ministry Program.

The Early Childhood Program (ECP) at First Presbyterian Church in Edmond continues to enhance the lives of many individuals and families in the Edmond/Oklahoma City area through the school's MISSION and VISION.

ECP'S MISSION is to promote the development of each child physically, emotionally, intellectually, socially, and spiritually at the child's own pace, through a developmentally appropriate curriculum.

ECP'S VISION is to provide model early childhood programs for the community through educational outreach based on Christian values.

ECP's Parent's Group continues to provide valuable perspective to the ECP Committee to ensure any needed improvements are communicated and handled appropriately.

Through the HighScope inspired curriculum, the ECP is continuing to offer children active participatory learning. Active learning means students have direct, hands-on experiences with people, objects, events and ideas. Children's interests and choices are at the heart of our Program.

Dedicated staff planning time was intentionally added to the teaching staff's schedule. Planning time is essential and provides valuable collaboration time, ultimately enhancing the overall educational experience for the students.

With surplus and additionally raised funds, ECP is consistently able to help acquire and maintain indoor and outdoor furniture and equipment.

In 2011, we were able to update some of the technology within the school and purchase iPads for the classrooms. We were also blessed to be able to allow several staff members to participate in the national HighScope Conference. Additionally, scholarship funds were available and awarded, as needed.

In the Spring of 2012, funds raised through the ECP Parents Group will allow for courtyard improvements. ECP's summer program, SandCastles, continues to serve families with a flexible summer enrichment alternative.

The First Presbyterian ECP employs and supports 30 educators who have a love for God and share that love with over 250 children, currently enrolled, from 1 year of age to 6 years of age. The majority of our teachers hold a college degree, most in the areas of Early Childhood Education or Elementary Education. All staff receive extensive training throughout the year.

We are so blessed to be a part of God's work through this wonderful outreach, touching the lives of many beautiful children and their families.
