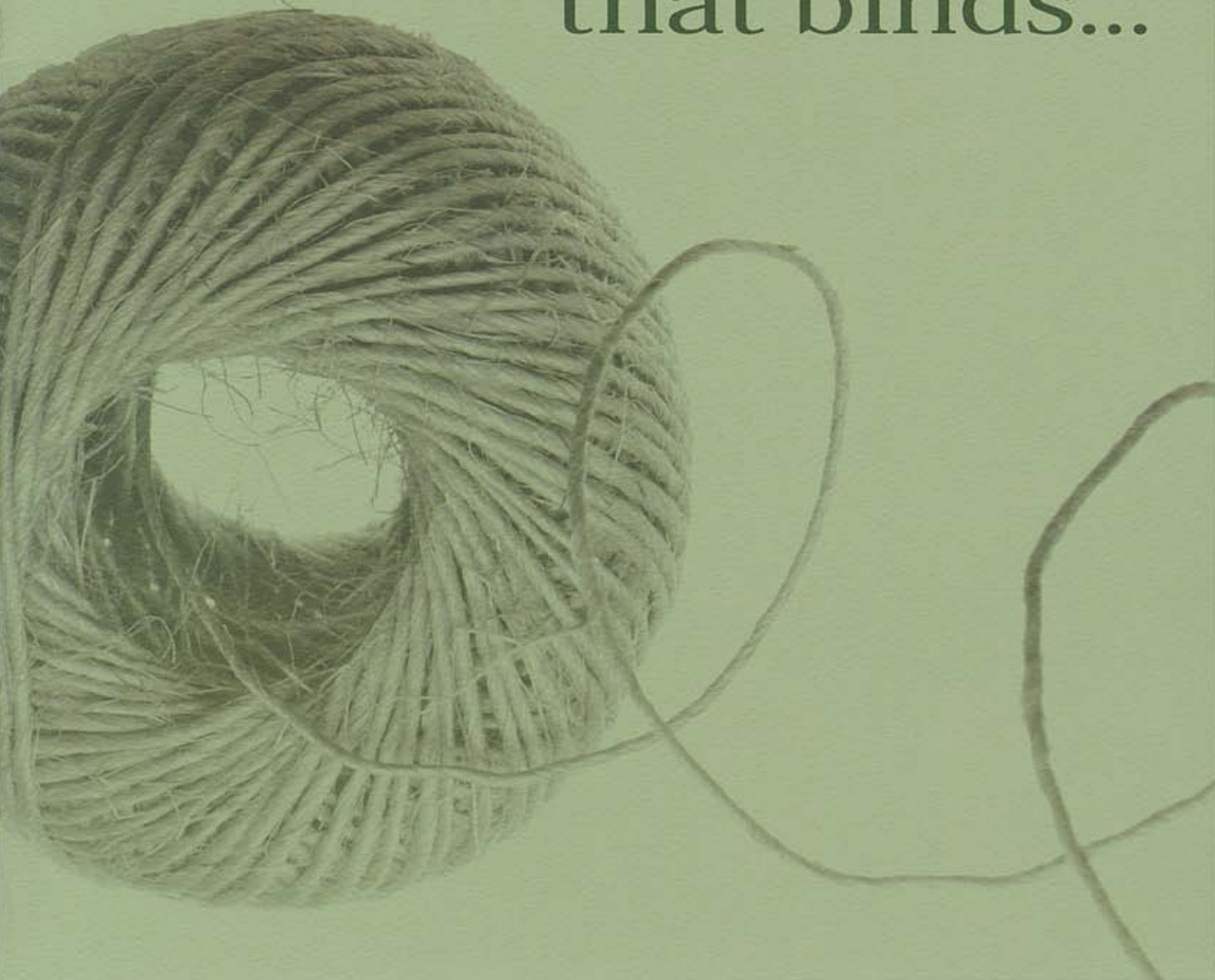

MISSION The mission of the Finance & Property Committee is to provide oversight of the management of the church's financial resources and oversee the management and maintenance of all church property.

During the calendar year 2010 the Property and Finance Committee oversaw the completion of our state of the art Yinger Youth Center at a total cost of \$1,468,116 from special gifts and Stone by Stone contributions. We were also able to apply nearly \$500,000 in Stone by Stone funds toward debt servicing on our mortgage with Bank of the West.

In keeping with the wishes of the congregation as expressed at our annual meeting in February, 2010 we were able to dispose of one our rental properties located in the block south of the Church. The proceeds of that sale were also used to reduce our obligation to Bank of the West.

Activities at the church facility continue to reflect accomplishments of the Church in the area of community relations and the vital life in missions and outreach we envision for our congregation.

The finance mission of this Committee continued to work smoothly with the very capable church staff. The year end financial report prepared by FPCE Member and Treasurer Rick Roberts is attached, offering insight into the management of that aspect of our church life.

Treasurer's Report

The year 2010 once again represented how God's blessings have been poured out in the finances of our church. Our members generously gave to God's work \$2,361,893 for the Operating Fund which was 99.6% of the original budget. In addition, our building fund, Stone by Stone, received \$803,541. Thus, for the second year in a row, our total income exceeded three million dollars.

The various committees and departments were good stewards, and held overall expenses to 1.1% less than their budgeted amounts, and we ended the year with a surplus of \$16,607 in the Operating Fund.

At the end of the year, our total Stone by Stone obligation is just over \$3.2 million. During 2010, we were able to make an additional repayment on the principal of our outstanding loans by \$200,000. If we are able to continue this early repayment, our goal is to be able to eliminate our current building debt one year early.

In 2010 the public accounting firm of Bell and Rhodes, performed an audit of the financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles as of December 31, 2009. No exceptions were found, and we received a "clean" audit opinion of our statements.

As we look ahead to 2011, we anticipate a very slight increase in our budget for next year. Considering the uncertain state of the economy, it is wonderful that this church family places a high priority in sharing the blessings we have been given with FPC of Edmond.

IN ORDER TO HELP THE SESSION IMPLEMENT ITS BOOK OF ORDER RESPONSIBILITIES,

the Personnel Committee has been charged with providing support and guidance to church staff members and committee chairpersons in the areas of recruiting, hiring, compensation, benefits, employee relations, personnel policy formulation, and performance management.

While the Personnel Committee serves in an advisory capacity to the Session, the Session is responsible for the overall health and ministry of the church. Our church's by-laws state that the Personnel Committee shall be made up of at least one Elder or Deacon, the Immediate Past Chairperson, and two or more Members-at-Large from the congregation.

- 6 Approved Revised Parish Nurse Job Description for Session review/approval.
- 7 Approved Associate Pastor Job Description for Session review/approval.
- 8 Provided guidance to the Human Resources/Finance department regarding 2011 salary budgeting.
- 9 Provided Proposal for Dental Coverage to be compared to current offering.

- 10 Provide assistance with performance improvement plans of certain staff.
- 11 Worked with Leo Wideman on transition to his new calling.

THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE SESSION'S DRC, or Denomination Relations Committee, is to improve our relationships with Presbytery, other churches within the Presbytery and with the Presbytery officers. We welcome assistance to the smaller Presbyterian churches with worship, administration and teaching. Although the whole church is responsible for living into this commitment, the Denominational Relations Committee seeks to lead that effort. In addition, the committee is responsible for communicating and informing the Session and membership about denominational issues and ministries that impact our denomination.

AN OVERVIEW OF DRC ACTIVITIES IN 2010:

The Denominational Relations Committee, with approval of Session, gave monthly support to:

- **Presbyterians for Renewal**
- **Frontier Fellowship Mission**
- **Wee Kirk Conference**
- **Presbyterian Coalition**
- **One by One**

With Session approval, DRC redirected 80% of General Assembly per capita for mission projects within the Presbytery.

MISSIONS WERE:

- **Hope Garden at Grace Presbyterian Church**, which is an outreach ministry growing and providing fresh vegetables for those who would be unable to purchase them.
- **Second Wind Ministry** is a coffee house ministry close to the OU campus where students can gather in a Christian environment.
- **Clinical Pastors' Education Program** which is at OU Health Science Center and educates the medical community in promoting spiritual direction with patients and their families.



NOTES OF IMPORTANCE: Jim Cahalan, from the DRC Committee, attended General Assembly to present an overture from Indians Nations Presbytery in opposition to the revision of the Book of Order, better known as the nFOG report. In March, 2010, the DRC Committee hosted Presbyterians for Renewal members for their board meeting at FPCE. They were provided with several meals and meeting places at the church.

FOUR COMMISSIONERS ARE SENT TO INDIAN NATIONS PRESBYTERY MEETINGS THREE TIMES A YEAR.

The current Session approved commissioners are Jim Cahalan, Don Coody, Charlotte Greaves, Tom Langdon and substitute commissioner, Larry Pulliam. Other DRC members are Letty Ann Schiesz, Jim Hartzog, Dwight Schulke, serving as secretary and Dr. Mateen Ellass, Staff Resource.

Music Ministries

MUSIC FOR 2010 IN REVIEW...

2010 was filled with several unique musical experiences and opportunities that added greatly to the breadth and scope of the Ministry of Music.

While it is always exciting to share special events, first it is important to recognize and thank the Sanctuary Choir directed by Jim VanHemert, Contemporary Choir directed by Terry Attebery, True North directed by Ben Meek, Chancel Bells directed by Terry Attebery, and JuBELLation, directed by Jim VanHemert, for their faithfulness in preparing and presenting music for worship on a weekly basis. Each of these groups has one common but important similarity – an uncompromised commitment to the worship of God and His Son, Jesus Christ through music. In addition to their tireless efforts, the following musical opportunities enriched our worship, our community of believers, and the Edmond community in general. Once again, we were blessed to have the Blackwelder Brass from Oklahoma City University. This brass quintet brought variety to our worship music as well as energy and excellence.

In February, the Wind Symphony from the University of Central Oklahoma presented a concert in our Sanctuary. This talented ensemble was led by Dr. Brian Lamb who serves as Director of Bands at the university and is a faithful member of our congregation. In May, two special recitals were presented in the Choir Room. The first recital featured fifteen students in our church who achieved a “One” or superior rating at District Contest. The program featured a wide spectrum of singers and instrumentalists. It was wonderful celebration of their talent, dedication, and discipline. The second recital featured the Chancel Bells, under the direction of Terry Attebery, and JuBELLation, under the direction of Jim VanHemert. The music on this recital featured sacred music the groups had rung throughout the year as well as secular music which would not have been inappropriate for them to ring in a worship setting.

In the fall, the Chancel Bells participated in a concert with the Wind Symphony at the University of Central Oklahoma. It was a wonderful opportunity for the bell choir to represent our church out in the community – away from our campus. Also in the fall, we were pleased to host one of the regional Salvation Army bands and songsters for a Saturday PM concert. The following morning both groups presented beautiful music within the context of our Sunday morning worship.

In December, the Sanctuary Choir and friends and orchestra presented CHRISTMAS CANTICLES – four suites of familiar carols. The orchestra was a blend of five professional musicians, students from Oklahoma City University, and seven of our members, two of which were high school students. The Wednesday after the concert, the choir along with the Chancel Bells and Kids’ Bells, went to the Touchmark Retirement Center to sing and ring for the residents.

SIMON SAYS – CHILDREN’S MUSICAL

On April 11, 2010 approximately seventy children, Pre-K through Fifth grade, filled our sanctuary’s choir loft and chancel. During both services, these children led the congregation in worship with the presentation of the musical, “Simon Says”. The setting was a modern day courtroom where Simon Peter was on trial, charged with fraud for preaching that Christ is the Son of God and the Messiah. The children portrayed many Biblical Characters who were eyewitnesses. They presented overwhelming evidence that Jesus is exactly who “Simon Says”. Rich with scripture and wonderful songs, this musical with its life-changing message will surely remain in the children’s hearts and minds. Praise God for the encouragement given by our staff and congregation.

ART CAMP 2010 – MADE FOR PRAISE In July 2010, the undercroft was filled to capacity with children attending the 5th annual Arts Camp. An outreach of the FPCE Music Ministry, the mission of the camp is to teach and encourage children how to use their creative talents and gifts to glorify God. This year, 55 campers, grades 3rd through 6th, enjoyed a variety of classes within many disciplines of the arts. The camp included classes in music, art, drama, and photography. Our fabulous instructors, many of whom have taught at the camp for several years and who are experts in their fields, guided the children as they strengthened their skills, while teaching them about the love of Christ and how we can all serve Him. The camp continues to be a community outreach mission of the Music Ministry. Over 56% of the campers this year were not members of First Presbyterian. The camp has also enjoyed a large percentage of return campers; 67% in 2010. We are blessed that former campers can be seen participating in many aspects of worship here at FPCE.

TRUE NORTH – CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP We in True North often say how blessed we are to return weekly to lead worship at First Presbyterian Church. Each of us endured difficult times this year. Though we didn't always feel up to it, God kept calling us to back to our roles as worship leaders, where we found once again that our needs were fully met and our spirits renewed. We rediscovered what we already knew – that difficult times soften us and prepare us to meet the Lord in prayer and in worship. The year began with Brad Baldwin being hospitalized for pancreatitis, to which he eventually succumbed. Had he lived only a week longer he would have seen his daughter, Alyssa, win the crown of Mrs. Oklahoma – a platform she sought from which to advocate for Cystic Fibrosis research. Brad always loved watching Alyssa perform. That knowledge and the demands of preparing for the pageant helped to soften the terrible impact of his loss for Alyssa, though only for a time. She and all of us miss Brad very much, but knowing that he loved and trusted the Lord and that we will see him again is a gift beyond price. Another tribulation for Ryan and Alyssa came later in the year when Ryan was among the last laid off from his company and left to face the uncertainty of caring for a daughter with special needs in a troubled economy. Despite the availability of few jobs, the Lord soon called Ryan to a new company in which he will be using his gifts in new ways. Despite the setback, Ryan and Alyssa were able to maintain their health insurance – critical to being able to give their daughter Hayden the care she needs.

In 2010 we were faced with some trials. Sherry lost her mother to cancer in mid-year. Despite her deep sadness she was able to see many tender mercies in her mother's last days and was able to praise God for His love and goodness to her mom and her family. Jan Gruel too lost her mother-in-law, Mary Gruel, who was beloved by all of us. Sherry and Jan both showed enormous peace throughout, demonstrating in their lives the faith all of us aspire to. Even through terrible sadness their faith was clear to us and helped lead all of us back into worship together. Justin's contributions to the band were tremendous throughout the year, as he was there to be counted upon during the many weeks we were shorthanded and unable to rehearse. He really was a pillar of strength for the team when we needed him most. We shared his joy at the birth of his new son, Evan. We also celebrated with Kyle and Maggie the birth of their son Ryan (albeit late in 2009). My own mother suffered a stroke late in the year but began a steady recovery, while my wife's father had a successful surgery for Parkinson's only to decline late in the year. God made himself known in many small triumphs and in the wonderful caregivers He placed along our paths. We are very grateful for the prayers and love of our church family.

Our lives have been bound together by time and Christian love. After more than 10 years together as True North, we have grieved and celebrated together and returned to worship always as the source of our strength. What we experienced in 2010 are the ordinary challenges of life, but they forced us at times to turn our attention to our own families. We could only hope and pray that in returning to worship, the Lord would inspire worship in spite of, or perhaps because of our personal situations. We could only lay our souls bare and wait upon the Lord.

Worship is for all of us a calling. The church's worship should be vital, energetic, intimate, and deep. We as a team believe first and foremost that if we ourselves are not worshipping, our leadership will be ineffective. But corporate worship does not depend solely on its leadership. Each worshipper has to lay bare his or her own heart in worship, because God doesn't want our illusions and self-love – he wants our whole selves. Such work is for each person to do – as leaders we can only hope to lead and inspire with God's blessing. I can say, however, that there are no finer servant leaders than Ryan, Alyssa, Tim, Sherry, Jan, Justin, Kyle and Tom. All of us are better worshippers and leaders from the trials of 2010. We will continue to try to live our faith in worship and to grow our leadership as God continues His work in us. May He continue to bless First Presbyterian Church and to meet all of us in worship every day of our lives.

LOCAL MISSION PROJECTS: MOPS, Infant Crisis Services, Citizens Caring for Children, Edmond Mobile Meals, Breakfast on Boulevard, HOPE Center, Presbyterian Urban Mission, Cooks Night Out, Member Educational Scholarships and financial help for individuals in crisis situations.

FPCE MISSION PROJECTS: Deacon's Fund, Baby Baskets, Staff Appreciation Event, Condolence and concern cards, choir dinners for OIM, Honorary Life Membership Award, meal preparations for special family needs.

REGIONAL MISSION PROJECTS: Goodland Home, Pledge to PW in Indian Nations Presbytery and scholarships.

NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL MISSION PROJECTS: Presbyterian Disaster Relief (in 2010-\$1,432), Samaritan's Purse, PW Birthday Offering, PW Thank Offering, Fellowship of the Least Coin (an ecumenical women's movement of prayer for peace and reconciliation), and Support for Missionary Families. Each circle supports a missionary family with Christmas, birthday gifts and financial help.

INCOME

Each Circle member contributes on a monthly basis during meeting months. An annual Poinsettia sale is held at FPCE. B.C. Clark Jewelers donates a cash commission to PW when church members make purchases and complete a church coupon. This amounted to \$242. The PW Council spent \$2,902 on Mission Projects this year. Each of the Circles contributes to its own mission projects in addition to this amount.

Early Childhood Program

ECP (EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAM) at First Presbyterian Church in Edmond, continues to enhance the lives of many individuals and families in the Edmond/Oklahoma City area through the school's mission and vision.

ECP'S MISSION is to promote the development of each child physically, emotionally, intellectually, socially, and spiritually at the child's own pace, through a developmentally appropriate curriculum.

ECP'S VISION is to provide model early childhood programs for the community through educational outreach based on Christian values.

ECP'S PARENT'S GROUP & ADVISORY BOARD continue to provide valuable perspective to the ECP Committee to ensure any needed improvements are communicated and handled appropriately. The implementation of "High Scope" curriculum has proven successful for all age levels within ECP and staff members have fully embraced its concepts. Also implemented this year was dedicated staff planning time which provides valuable collaboration time, ultimately enhancing the overall educational experience for the students.

With surplus and additional raised funds, ECP was, again, able to contribute to outdoor playground repairs and indoor furniture and play equipment additions, as well as designate funds for participation in the "High Scope" conference in May 2011. Additionally, scholarship funds were available and awarded as needed. ECP's summer program, SandCastles, continued its success with full enrollment in 2010.

WE ARE BLESSED to be a part God's work through this wonderful outreach, touching the lives of many beautiful children and their families.

- ECP enrollment for the 2010-2011 school year is 239 and 2010 Sandcastles enrollment was 192.
- 78% of ECP's enrollment represents families who are not members of FPCE.
- ECP has 14 different classes and 31 staff members.
- ECP's fall fundraiser, FestiFall, raised over \$8,000 in October 2010.

Kids' Ministries

WE HAD A GREAT YEAR IN KIDS' MINISTRIES WITH A WONDERFUL COMMITTEE: Paula Jones & Sarah Montgomery were the elders. Amy Reid, Jennifer Reid, Staci Oakes, and Nancy Brown also served on our team. We began the new year with a wonderful trip of about 30 of our 4th and 5th graders and their parents to SuperStart Live in Tulsa, OK! The kids were encouraged to harness all of their natural energy and use it to serve God! In March, we celebrated the resurrection of Jesus, with the giving of Easter baskets to the children at the City Rescue Mission. We also were outward focused during that time as the children raised Pennies for Pigs for the Uganda Mission. The goal was to raise over \$350. They well-exceeded this goal so Pastor Mateen kissed a pig at the Pentecost picnic as a "reward."

THE CHILDREN'S PASTORS' CONFERENCE in San Diego, CA was attended by Shelly Fryer and Linda Birsner in March 2010. We were filled to the brim and were definitely overflowing with ideas and renewed energy and a fresh calling to new ministry for Christ. One of the highlights included a major emphasis on having the home be the primary place for spiritual direction, leadership, and growth with the help of the church. Another huge takeaway was when we met with an organization that does outreach Bible studies with kids in low income areas. We were very excited to begin this as God had been stirring this in our hearts.

A MINISTRYSAFE WORKSHOP was held with presenters from Texas, offering us lots of important information on ways to safeguard our children. Each volunteer and staff person is now required to fill out a child protection policy form, as well as take a MinistrySafe class and pass a test.

SUMMER STORY IN 5D Our summer was filled with 5 big events and several smaller ones during "Summer Story in 5D." This was a way that kids could use all 5 senses in 5 big ways throughout the summer to know God better, and where "no one gets left behind" due to vacations, camps or illness. Throughout the entire summer, we held Vacation Bible School during Sunday School as we went on a High Seas Adventure with Paul and Peter. We began the summer with a family fun day at Vox Printing with a huge water slide, mud pit, cookout and lots of other games. Alan Root from Nashville, Tennessee flew in to give a great concert and share the gospel. It was meant to be a concert in the park for the community, but was moved to our sanctuary due to rain. We had a life-size game night of "R U Board?" with a humongous Twister game, Sorry game (Forgiveness), Battleship game (Spiritual Warfare), Candyland (Heaven) as well as a Scrabble craft game making the names of Jesus and an introduction to the game of Life (the gospel). We ended the summer with a pool party at Pelican Bay.

CAMP KIDJAM We took a group of 3rd-5th graders and leaders to Camp Kidjam in Sherman, TX in July. There we continued to find out more about the faith of Paul and how we could Jump into faith and action! I don't think I have ever seen a group of kids so excited! We began our Rolling Green Outreach ministry in

collaboration with other churches during the summer by sharing sack suppers and lots of fun and games each Thursday evening at the apartment complex. Since that time, we now meet with the Rolling Green Collaborative, we have weekly Backyard Bible Clubs, Little Lambs, monthly holiday parties, a Santa store, and meet the needs of individual families. Our mission is to bring the love of Christ to a community in need.

IN FALL 2010, we had a great Parent Teacher Orientation encouraging everyone to make the discipleship of our children a priority. We began our Sunday School rotation with "Digging into the Bible" and we began BLAST again on Wednesday evenings for kids' faith to really take off! The 2nd graders received their Bibles after completing the worship and Bible class led by Eunice Menja and a team of teachers and shepherds. We held a monthly Parents' Night Out evening to give parents an opportunity to spend time with just each other and thus strengthen their marriage. It was also a wonderful time for the kids to play together and have a very fun evening. We also coordinated a "Family Matters" class with the help of the family life committee. This Wednesday evening class consisted of a different speaker sharing a different topic each week. We once again ended the year by collecting over 150 shoeboxes to share with kids around the world for Christmas. We celebrated the last Sunday of the year with a birthday party for Jesus. Nursery Ministries

CHILDCARE & PRESCHOOL MINISTRIES We continue to grow strong and healthy in 2010! We have seen a continued growth in young families becoming involved in the life of the church. **Little Lambs:** our outreach ministry which was started in March, has proven to be a positive growth area. Its evangelistic approach to ministry for 2's and 3's has enabled us to focus on 8 students at a time for 8 weeks of classes. We have had 24 children participate in the program so far, and half of them have not been "regular" church kids. **Rolling Greens:** the most exciting addition to the program has been our class that meets at the Rolling Green apartment complex on Thursday mornings. We hope that, by building on the relationship that was started in our summer outreach activity, we can continue to be an active part of that community.

VBS DURING SUNDAY SCHOOL was another great success for preschool ministry. Our 3-5 year olds were able to participate in large group worship with the elementary children, and then split into age appropriate craft, snacks, and lessons with their own crew leaders. The relationships they had with their youth volunteers was an added bonus!

We continue to have childcare for the Edmond Family Center for Autism support group. This support group meets at our church every second Tuesday of the month. We offer childcare for birth-age 12. This has been a wonderful opportunity for our staff with the addition of supplemental training from experienced therapists in the field of autism.

Our regular Sunday morning and Wednesday JAM activities remain strong. We continue to provide morning and evening nurseries for Small Groups, Miriam Circle, Bible Study groups, MOPS and meetings. We had approximately 5,800 children attend childcare ministry this year!

6 MEMBERS OF FPC EDMOND completed SM (Stephen Ministries) training and were commissioned on April 15, 2010. Over 200 persons have been commissioned into the program since its inception in 1983. The total number of active SM participants during the year was 19 including the 6 newly trained. By years end, 4 active Stephen Ministers elected to go inactive, reducing Stephen Ministers to 15 (which includes one inactive Stephen Minister that returned from sabbatical to active duty.

THE STEPHEN MINISTER LEADERS TEAM consisted of 6 members at the beginning of 2010 and dropped to 5 leaders at midyear with Mark Britton leaving in April. Plans are in place for Martha Turner to join the Leader's Team following her completion of National Training in January.

A TOTAL OF 17 CARE RECEIVERS were served over the course of the year with 7 assignments reaching termination and 10 assignments remaining active at year's end. Because of the increased size of the active SM group, a new format for conducting the Supervision Group resulted in dividing the group (different room assignments for Care Taker Check-In) after the group first meets all together for devotionals and SM planning updates.

The Supervision of active Stephen Ministers by leaders is scheduled twice monthly and was moved from the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays to accomodate the newly commissioned Stephen Minister's schedules. Continuing Education is scheduled on a quarterly basis in place of a Supervision meeting and is typically open to church members and outsiders. 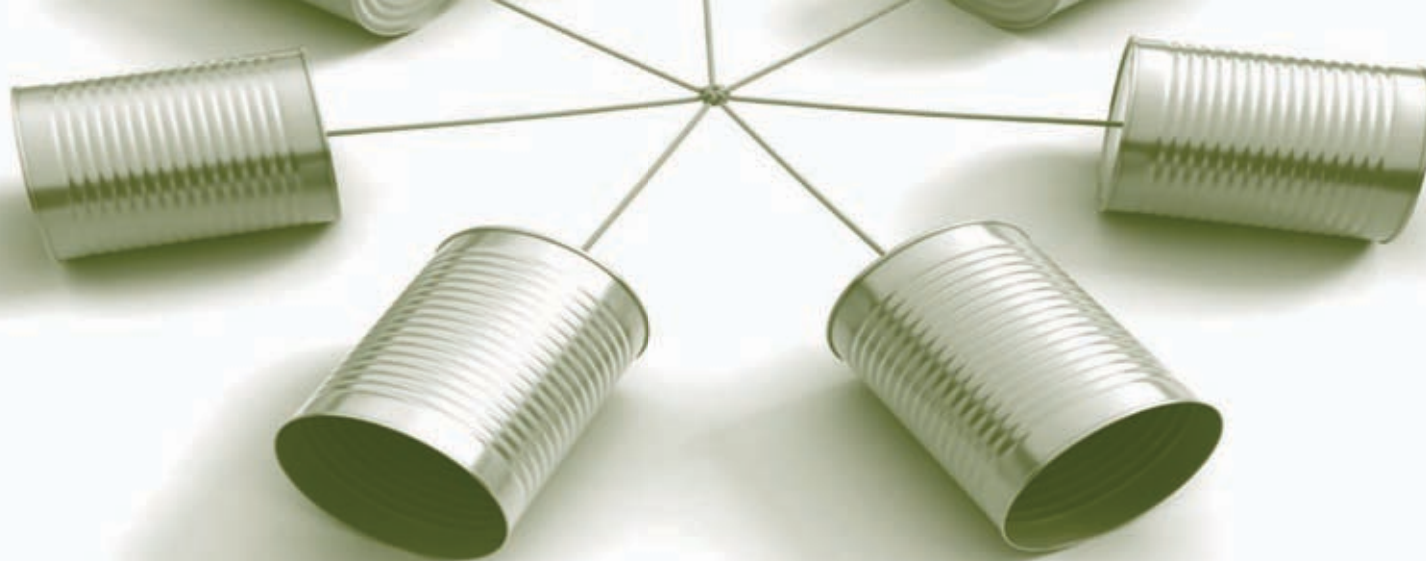

The FPCE Communications Department was challenged early in 2010 to make adjustments both in resources and personnel. Budget constraints early in the year caused The PRES to become a quarterly feature magazine. The impact of two departures from the department in late 2009 greatly impacted production and left the department with fragmented communications held together by the Print Media Coordinator. In March 2010, Bill Parrish was added to the staff as Director of Communications. This new strategic role in conjunction with Zena Nipper, Print Media Coordinator, provides support to FPCE ministries through design, cohesive messages and brand. Our focus immediately became accessing the state of Communications vehicles, and in conjunction with the Communications Committee we began the process of an aggressive Strategic Communications Plan for 2011.

Church Members and staff have continued to support the PRES with feature stories and relevant information.

The PRES has continued to be an on-line and hardcopy source of church news, schedules and spiritual resources for our membership, however it is a vehicle that we are looking at repurposing in 2011.

As part of the Communications Plan for 2011, we will introduce an upgraded website in the spring, with a focus on visitors and regular attenders, social media and blogging. This will be an ongoing process with adjustments to the site made over time. The Plan also includes the development of three information areas, complete with print media. One will be for visitors only, and the others will provide ministry brochures, newsletters and plasma screens displaying regular information. The goal is a unified "look and feel" to ministries via both printed collateral and electronic media. With the departure of an Associate Pastor, Communications has taken on the management of Information Technology. Among the goals accomplished for 2010 was:

- Consolidation of our existing copiers/purchase of new technology through Xerox.
- Addition of a new second server to offset an overloaded single server.
- Emergency replacement of the Firewall that was in place.

Through the efforts of the Print Media Coordinator, and systems we have put in place to manage activity, we are poised and excited about the Plan for 2011.
